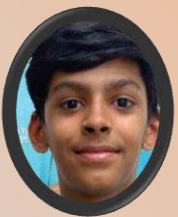


The Tenth Man

Back Mudra: it is for back ache. It reduces muscle cramping sever back pain can be reduced.

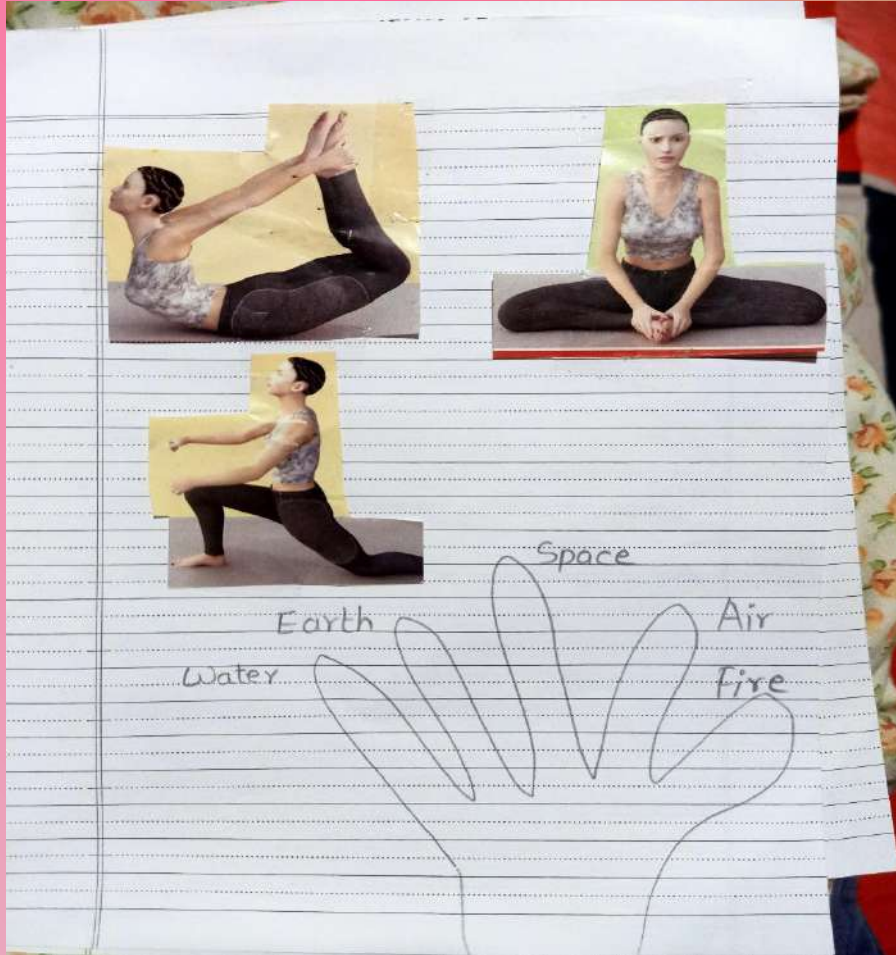
Prithvi Mudra: Do it for 20 mins .

All four of the newest elements are highly unstable super heavy metals. **Heavy elements** are those that have an atomic number larger than 92. **Super heavy elements** usually have atomic numbers larger than 112. Super heavy elements are also more **radioactive** and **unstable** than [other elements](#).

Super heavy elements do not occur in nature. The new elements were created in laboratories. Scientists use machines called **particle accelerators** to make **ions** (a charged element) of one element crash into the ions of another element. Ions are charged atoms. When the nuclei crash together, they may join together. If the nuclei join, a new element is created. But these artificially created elements only exist for a fraction of a second before they decay into other elements.

SEL (Social and Emotional Learning)

Why SEL is a Vital part of life?

“If children live with acceptance, they learn to love. If children live with security, they learn to have faith in themselves and others. If children live with friendliness, they learn the world is a nice place in which to live.” This is the gist of the poem by Dorothy Low Nolte.

Along with the academics it's our responsibility as parents and teachers to bring up well functioning child. Social Emotional Learning Skills sessions (SEL) are the best way to instil the right values and attitudes within them. These skills as a parent at home and as a teacher at school to be inculcated plays a crucial role in making them able to identify their own emotions, triggers, to make them able to respond to them in a socially acceptable manner and to learn the core human values.

At elementary school level children should have the vocabulary to express themselves. They need words to say how they feel. With the Social emotional Learning skills modules conductions in the school, children are explained “My Emotions wheel” where the children get to know with the basic vocabulary for the feelings. With the various scenarios given they might be asked to label their Feelings. Also, they are taught the classroom rules with fun activities.

Going a level further, Children are taught advance vocabulary for feelings in order to make them able to express themselves in more effective manner. To manage their emotions in an effective manner they need to know the trigger and the appropriate way to express negative feelings like anger and frustration. With various insightful activities to make them practice in school setting like breathing, mindfulness, they are taught to manage these negative emotions. Other topics in SEL sessions like Impulse control, increasing frustration tolerance, respecting others, conflict management, resilience, Gratitude are also handled.

After 2 years of pandemic and online schooling children need to know the changes in socialization and various ways of socialization being possible after pandemic. Making them bring back in the offline school mode it has been a challenging task for them to become organised, Some behaviour and emotional difficulties are also observed. To cope with such issues SEL sessions are playing important role.

As a counsellor, I express my gratitude to play an active role in delivering interesting and insightful modules designed by Inclusive Education Cell (IEC) PIS in our school. It helped me to connect with the children in order to connect to them even after 2 years of huge gap of online schooling.
