# METHODS FOR EFFECTIVE STUDYING

- Keep study space distraction free: If you have phones, give it to your parents so you don't get distracted throughout your study session. If you use devices for studying, then there are apps that block other social media apps. For example:- Forest app.
- Focus on tasks, not schedules: Don't assign particular timings for studying a subject. For example, don't study 1 hour science, 1 hour maths; but instead study a particular subtopic that day.
- Skimming through chapters: Before you start studying, you should skim through the chapters, take a note of the diagrams, graphs, etc. and try to recall if you remember anything from the subtopics taught in class. It is alright if you don't, because you will be studying that chapter soon, but it is good to know the contents and what you will learn before actually starting.
- **Teach:** Explain topics to your brain as if you are teaching it. Teach your brain out loud. Or teach a random chair. This way, you understand
- Spaced repetition: What you are studying once, you are bound to forget it, unless you have super memory power, (which is quite rare). Hence what you study needs to be repeated at least a few times, depending on how difficult the topic is.
- Active Recall: This is an amazing method to study, especially for exams. In this method when you study a topic, you create questions related to the part you read. Later once you are done studying that topic, you write down the answers to those questions separately (Not just orally saying the answer, it is not as effective as writing). In this way you practice on how to answer the questions in exams.
- Practice: After studying, you should solve different questions to recall everything you have learnt. This helps you to search and obtain information from different corners of your brain, thus training your brain for exams and to recall.
- Understand concepts, don't by heart: Understanding what you study is very very important. When you understand the concepts, you will know it for lifelong.
- Concepts maps: Drawing mind maps and concept maps can make you understand the connection between various topics. Diagram based studying is also very helpful, especially for "visual" learners.
- Ask questions: If you don't understand something, ask your teacher! Don't ever be scared to ask questions. Teachers are here to help us understand concepts, clear our doubts and they will be more than happy to help you. If you are too scared to ask during class, meet the teacher alone later and ask. So the next time you have a doubt, remember to ask your subject teacher.
- **Studying ≠ Exams:** You study to learn. Exams are to test how much you remember, but when you study, you should be studying to learn, not for exams. Learning is more important. This attitude can change the entire way you look at studying.
- Consistency: The most important tip that is often neglected is consistency. You need to study what has been taught in class every single day. Never postpone it to the next day, because you will end up never doing it. When you postpone it repeatedly and end up doing it at the last minute, right before the exam, it is called "procrastination", which is really problematic as you go for higher studies.


