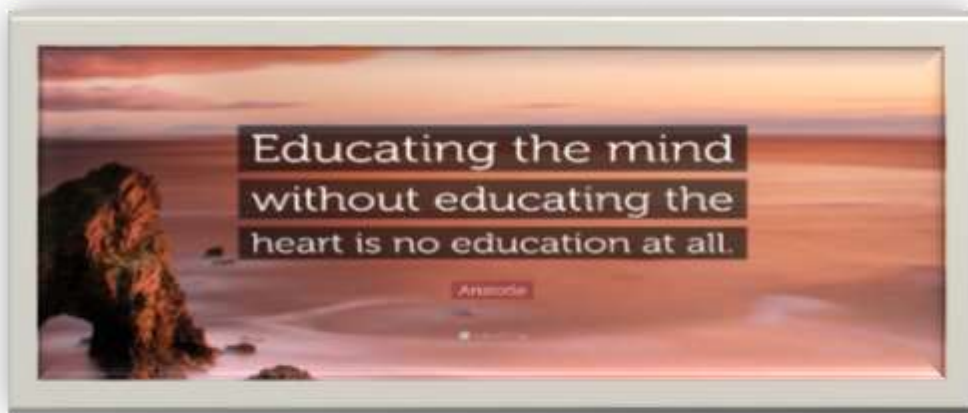


General Manager's Message


Principal's Message

1st humanoid launch in space by India?

Gaganyaan is a humanoid/crewed space mission which is expected to be a successful mission. The word Gaganyaan is derived from Sanskrit in which 'gagan' means sky and 'yaan' means craft. So, gaganyaan means 'SkyCraft'.

Gaganyaan is a small capsule like object which will be ejected in lower earth orbit. The capsule will carry 3 astronauts. Gaganyaan capsule is made by DRDO, ISRO and HAL. The mass of whole capsule is 8,200 kg (with service module). In May 2019 the crew module was designed and the plan is to be executed in 2022.

There are 3 types of flight test which will be conducted according to ISRO:

1. Test flight 1: On December 2020 – No Crew
2. Test flight 2: On July 2021 – No Crew
3. Crewed: December 2021 or January 2022 – To conduct a flight with crew members, it is not easy to send in one go there are many tests to be conducted by ISRO. The tests conducted are as follows:

1. Re-entry test: 18 December 2014 – Success
2. Pad abort test: 5 July 2018 – Success
3. Gaganyaan 1: 2021 – Planned
4. Gaganyaan 2: 2022 – Planned
5. Gaganyaan 3: 2022 – Planned



The rocket will launch in Shriharikota at Satish Dhawan Space Centre. The date of launch is varying as it is planned. The 3 astronauts include 2 humans and 1 robot. The 2 astronauts will be selected from Indian Air Force and the robot is made and its name is 'Vyomitra'.

The robot will indicate about differing pressures and would warn many things when they go wrong. The HSFC (Human Space Flight Centre) is training the astronauts and would select it for this mission. There are many countries who are helping ISRO in this mission like Russia. ISRO scientist said that there will be microgravity activity done in lower earth orbit. We will make this history by sending the astronauts in space.

Good Manners

1. Saying “please” and “thank you”



This is one of the first basic manners to teach your child. The importance of saying ‘please’ when asking for something and ‘thank you’ when receiving something should be instilled in children, from the start. Put this into practice at all

times, so it will eventually come naturally to them.

2. Asking before taking anything

Children should learn to ask permission before taking anything that is not theirs, even with people like Mom and Dad. They should also be taught to return anything they have borrowed, with proper thanks.



3. Saying ‘Sorry’



Along with ‘please’ and ‘thank you’, saying sorry when you have done something wrong is also an important habit to instil in your child. Teach your child when and where to say sorry, and not use it casually. Empathy is a skill they have to imbibe.

4. Knocking on Doors Before Entering

Kids should be taught that privacy is paramount, especially at home. They should know that it is respectful to knock on someone's door and ask permission before entering the room. Doing so in front of your kids will help them pick it up as a good habit.



5. Covering One's Mouth When Sneezing or Coughing



Teach your kids to cover their mouths when they sneeze or cough. Also, teach them that picking one's nose in public is considered rude and unpleasant. This is not only a part of good manners, but also hygiene.

6. Saying 'Excuse Me'

This is another basic manner for children to learn. Children are naturally impatient, so they have to be taught to say 'excuse me' and ask permission to talk. They should also know when and how to enter a conversation without interrupting anyone.



7. Not Making Fun of People

This should be taught very early on, as if it is not, children might think it is okay to make fun of people. They should be taught that it is never okay to hurt someone's feelings by making fun of them or bullying them in public or private.

8. Phone Etiquette



Your child should know how to talk on the phone and also be silent and listen when someone on the other end is talking. This will help make him/her leave a good impression on people.

9. Showing Respect to Elders

Adults have been on this Earth since a longer time, and kids should be taught that experience leads to wisdom and wisdom leads to respect. They should be taught to show respect to their parents, grandparents, teachers, and any other adults they encounter. One way of doing



this can be by always serving food to the elders, before the kids, or giving up a seat on public transport to an older adult, while your kid is watching. They will know that showing deference to age indicates good manners.

10. Learning and Remembering People's Names

Using and remembering someone's name shows that you have made an effort to recognise and remember them. Teach your kid to remember a friend's name or family member's name by using it often with him or her.

11. Being Kind to People with Disabilities

Children are naturally curious about everything, so if they see a person with some disability, they would point and stare, ask questions loudly, or even be scared. They should be taught that such people with disabilities are just like everyone else and should be treated with the same consideration.



12. Being a Good Guest

Teach your kids to be considerate and polite when visiting their friend's homes. They should know how to be adaptable to the other family's schedules, not be stubborn or fussy with the food served and to express their preferences without being vague. Kids should also be taught to greet hosts well, when visiting their homes.

13. Having a Conversation the Right Way



Children should learn that yelling, shouting and screaming are not the right methods to communicate. No matter how angry or irritated they are, they should be taught to speak softly and put their point across. You can help your child to learn this by doing the same in front of them. Also, teach them to wait until the other person is done talking, before taking their turn. This will also make your kids listen to you.

14. Learning to Share

This habit becomes very important for kids when they play with others. They should be taught that sharing is caring and to share their toys or food. You can start teaching this quality by incorporating the act of sharing when you play with them and point out that doing so adds to the fun.



15. Cleaning Up After Themselves

Kids can be messy eaters or not put away their clothes or toys properly after using



them. To inculcate the habit of cleaning up in them, you can teach them to rinse their dishes in the sink after eating or ask them to help with household chores. They will automatically learn to clean up, as time goes by.

16. Be Honest

Start teaching kids to be honest and not tell any lies, from a young age. These are core values that need to be inculcated in your children. Make sure that they stick to what they've said. If they make empty promises, sit them down and explain why it is important to tell the truth. Be firm and tell them that honesty is the best policy. Moral Development is significant, from early on.



17. Establishing Eye Contact with Others

Maintaining eye contact while having a conversation indicates social confidence



and respect for people. Teach this to your kids by spending quality time with them and practising eye contact while speaking. If they learn this ability, they will grow up to have good social relationships with people.

18. Never Using Foul Language

Foul language is highly disrespectful and unpleasant. Kids should be taught never to use foul language in front of anyone, even if they have heard it on TV or outside somewhere. It is an essential habit to learn. Sit them down and explain why it is not okay to use such language.



Good manners are basic elements that will instil a sense of etiquette in your children and make them better human beings when they grow up. They will find it easy to get along with people, succeed at work or school, and develop good relationships with others around them. A polite, considerate child will make the best impression on the world. So, start teaching your kids these manners when they are young, itself!

Amazing parenting in animal world

[Fun facts]

There's more than one way to successfully pass on genes. Many species don't invest in caring for their offspring at all, simply going for large numbers and leaving it for the strongest few to survive.

Others, however, invest heavily in trying to give their young the best start in life.

Here are top animals with truly astonishing parental strategies to ensure the success of the next generation.

Weddell seal (*Leptonychotes weddellii*)



Weddell seals are one of the many species in which mothers must take on the mammoth task of raising babies, and equipping them with essential life skills, single-handedly. Making this job even tougher, these dedicated parents live around the

Antarctic, where conditions are among the most extreme on Earth.

Once her baby is born, she must quickly teach it how to survive the Antarctic's dangerous waters and landscape. At just two weeks old, seal pups are coaxed by their mothers into the water. One essential lesson is learning to navigate the underwater landscape, finding the best air holes to avoid becoming trapped under the ice. And on the ice, mothers teach their babies to use their teeth to open new air holes and to file back existing ones to stop them freezing over.

Mums raise a baby every year in this freezing environment. And, although it is physically draining, she has an extra trick up her sleeve: she provides her baby with milk that consists of 60% fat – the most calorific of any mammal milk – to aid its quick development.



Otters show their babies when they are **in danger to make the enemy **feel mercy.****

Otters show their babies when they are facing danger to make a predator feel compassion for them.

The way that otters care for their young shows how intelligent they are. After giving birth, the mother and the babies are protected by the father. Before the babies are born, the family stock piles food so they don't have to leave the nest when the babies are young.

Clownfish (*Amphiprioninae*)



Clownfish, the starring animal of the animated film about paternal love *Finding Nemo*, makes brilliant parents in real life.

They do this by working together.

Before the arrival of their young, they meticulously clean an anemone to transform it into a perfect nursery, covering their own skin with protective mucus to prevent paralysing anemone stings.

Once the eggs are laid and fertilised, clownfish dads clean them until they hatch, and both parents fan the developing babies with their fins to provide them with a constant supply of oxygen-rich water to increase their chances of survival.

Strawberry poison-dart frog (*Oophaga pumilio*)



Another super parent pair of the animal world is the diminutive strawberry poison dart frog. After females lay their eggs on the rainforest floor, the finger-nail-sized frog dads keep guard from predators. But the action really starts when the clutch hatches into tiny tadpoles. If

they are left together the babies will eat each other. So to keep them all safe, mother frogs transport each and every baby, individually, on her back up into trees to find a safe pool of water in which to deposit them separately. She then visits each individual nursery pool every day for about 50 days to lay an unfertilised egg in the pools to keep her babies fed. Meanwhile, father frogs continuously guard the territory to stop rivals finding the babies.

Caecilians (Gymnophiona)

Caecilians look like huge worms but are in fact amphibians. They are found in almost every rainforest but these extraordinary animals spend most of their time in underground lairs.



Here, the mother feeds her larvae by letting them lick a secretion at an opening on her body called a “cloaca”. And in a more gruesome twist, she lets her babies, which have sharp tiny teeth, tear off and eat her fatty, nutrient-rich skin. She re-

grows her skin every three days to keep feeding them.

Adelie penguin

When it comes to Herculean parental pair work, Adelie penguin mums and dads are stars of the animal world, making huge efforts to bring up their precious babies in sub-zero Antarctic conditions. A successful nest must be built using stone piles to keep the egg off the ground. So prized are these stones that some penguins have been seen turning criminal to get rocks from neighbours’ nests.



When the females finally arrive and lay eggs, parents take it in turns to keep their egg continuously incubated: if it is left in the cold for more than five minutes it will never hatch. Mums and dads rotate fishing expeditions until their ravenous babies grow almost as large as them. Adelie penguin dads are among the hardest working animal fathers – but it’s an all or nothing parental strategy. If the father goes missing, the mother will abandon the nest because it is impossible for her to raise her chick alone.

African elephant (*Loxodonta africana*)



In elephants, entire family groups bring up the tiniest members of the herd. African elephants roam savannahs as herds of females, led by a matriarch. Elephants live for up to 70 years and females produce a new calf every three or four

years. Their pregnancies are incredibly long – almost 2 years. In times of danger group parenting comes into its own as all the older elephants form an outward-facing circle when under threat, keeping the vulnerable calf protected in the middle. Occasionally baby elephants are kidnapped by females from other groups. When this happens, the baby’s entire herd might group together, looking more powerful and threatening, in order to get back their precious cargo.

Galápagos sea lion (*Zalophus wollebaeki*)

Sea lions on the Galápagos Islands have a fail-safe parenting system in place which sees babies well fed, protected, and with plenty of time to play and practise vital life skills. Groups of up to 30 mothers, often already with “toddlers”, give



birth on a beach which is under continuous guard by a single male. Mothers are part of his harem but benefit because they have plenty of time to feed. This prime location comes complete with a “nursery pool” where they can drop off their babies from a week old to play with other pups and be watched over by a rotating cycle of female carers. Older offspring take to the shallows to practise their hunting skills, especially by teasing the island’s marine iguanas.

Caribbean flamingo (*Phoenicopterus ruber*)

The Caribbean flamingo – the brightest member of the flamingo family also known as the American flamingo – has a unique strategy to ensure its babies have a healthy start. Both mother and father flamingos feed their little one with red "milk". Now, these birds haven't suddenly



grown mammary glands. But flamingos and a few other birds (the others being pigeons and male emperor penguins) can make a nutrient rich substance in a part of their digestive tract called the crop – a muscular pouch near the gullet or throat. The nutritious liquid is full of fat and protein – just like normal milk. This allows chicks to feed before their bills are ready to filter crustaceans and algae out of the water to eat. Female produce a hormone called prolactin. And the unusual food contains chemicals which give the baby its pink colouration. The process, meanwhile, leaves its parents pale and washed out.

Giant Pacific octopus (*Enteroctopus dofleini*)



The 4m-long giant Pacific octopus – the largest octopus's species in the world – lays and tends to one super brood of about 100,000 eggs. So dedicated are these mothers to their eggs, carefully caressing them to keep them clean and supplied with oxygen, that they have no chance

to feed or look after themselves. After six months of dedicating themselves solely to safeguarding their eggs, the mothers die once the eggs hatch. The giant Pacific octopus, however, is not the record holder for dedicated brooding. One deep-sea octopus was recorded guarding her eggs for four years and five months, in a Pacific Ocean canyon off the Californian coast in the US. The scientists who observed her from a submarine said it was likely she didn't eat for this entire time.

Artificial Intelligence

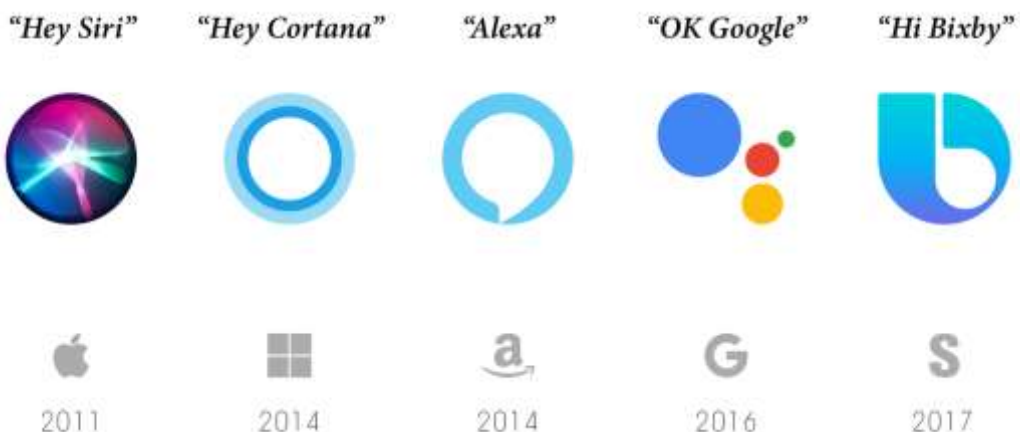

Humans are the most intelligent beings of this blue planet. We all have our inbuilt intelligence but by learning we gain knowledge and sharpen our intelligence same way the race is to replicate a human brain. If medical science makes it possible to clone the human brain thus we have an ambitious and ardent desire to replicate the human intelligence and emotions in the cloned brain and the only way that leads to it is Artificial Intelligence. Artificial Intelligence(AI) is the branch of Computer Science that endeavours to replicate or simulate human intelligence in a machine. Artificial Intelligence exists since ages, but it came to trend just a decade ago and now we are living up the age of AI.

AI systems are fuelled by algorithms and it revolves around basic techniques as train and learn. Machine learning algorithms feed computer data to AI systems, using statistical techniques to enable AI system to learn. These algorithms help the system to train and learn how to perform the tasks later without even having a program written. All AI systems fall into one of the three types:

1. Artificial Narrow Intelligence – These are also called as weak / narrow AI. This is the only type of artificial intelligence which is realized till date. With these AI systems we have been able to achieve facial and speech recognition. For example, Alexa by Amazon, Google Search, Cortana by Microsoft, Siri by Apple, Self-Driving cars, drone robots and disease mapping and prediction tools, social media bots and many more.



2. Artificial General Intelligence – This is also called as strong/deep AI. These systems will be able to think, understand and act in a way just like a

human would have reacted in a given situation. In which case it is challenging to achieve as cognitive abilities are to be programmed with efficacy. These machines would have to take experiential learning to the next level, such that the knowledge can be applied to a vivid range of problems. For Example: Fujitsu-built K, one of the fastest supercomputers is one of the most notable attempts at achieving strong AI but it has a long way to go.

How fast is the K computer?

If the world's **7 billion people** could perform **one computation per second**, it would take about **17 days** to complete **10,000,000,000,000,000** (one Kei) computations.



The K computer can complete **one Kei** of computations in **just one second**.

3. Artificial Super Intelligence –

This is hypothetical as we aim here the machines not only to mimic human intelligence and behaviour rather we are aiming for these machines to be self-aware and surpass the humans. Thus we speculate our survival as super intelligent beings may try ideas like self-preservation.



Two scenarios are food for thought as per the scientists:

- AI could be programmed to do something devastating
- AI could be programmed to do something beneficial, but develop a destructive method for achieving its goal

Then what is the future of AI? It seems to be the burning question of the hour. One cannot accurately predict all impacts of AI but yes, certainly the entire scientific community is working on it so that we can define our future is about humans and machines working together in harmony. It is super exciting that we are the part and parcel of this revolution.

The story of hotwheels

As you all know that kids and Children like to play with toy cars. Hotwheels is a brand that produces toy cars under Mattel's toy company.



The company has been founded in 1961. Their first car set has been released on May 18, 1968. The set was called the 'Original Sweet 16'. 11 of them were designed by Harry Bentley Bradley. He also designed the body 'Dodge Dearo'. Each car's wheels had red pinstripes because of which they were called 'red striped wheels'. In addition to the cars Mattel also produced racing tracks for cars, which were originally painted bright Orange. The cars made were made up of wide, hard plastic tires that caused less friction to let the cars to move more quickly and freely, it was one of the Important features of them. There were one or two super charger sections that were used to speed up up the cars. Hotwheels cars were designed to move at high speeds which was a great innovation of that time. Hotwheels were a big success of that time. Their competitors needed to completely rethink and redesign their die cast car models. Hotwheels were recognized the hottest brand of small toy car models in USA. Mattel also made sure that each of the Hotwheels cars can be used in every play set and stunt track. The sizzlers car set and the heavy weight tracks were released on 1969. Ira Gilford was joined with Larry Wood in designing cars. Their first design was the tri baby. Ira Gilford was still designing cars in 2014. Mattel introduced the 'mongoose' and 'the snake', the rivalry between two drag racers, and for more publicity. In 1969 they released a car set called 'The Silver Series'. The cars in the silver series were silver painted, their names were 'Boss Hoss, Heavy Cheavy and king kuda'

these cars were only available if you had a membership with the Hotwheels club. These cars came in the mail. These three cars featured super powered engines without hoods which featured the modern style drag racing cars of the era. These cars were popular among children and were considered faster than the others gravity models. These cars were never tested under the under scientific conditions. On the success of Hotwheels, Mattle produced the 'sizzler's range'. These cars had Nimmo tech batteries that can run up to five minutes. The 'Thick black track' was introduced on 1970, these tracks are wide and thick so that the sizzlers can run freely on the tracks. 1972-3 were slow years because less models were released. So Hotwheels thought to do exotic paint work and design on the cars. They also removed the red pinstripes on the tires, so they were no longer called red striped tires. Hotwheels have also released monster toy trucks such as 'Bone Shaker, Twin Mill, Old Punk Loco, etc.' there are also tracks made for the monster trucks. Collecting Hotwheels is a passion of every major and minor. Michael Zarnock has the largest collection of Hotwheels cars in the world. he has also a record for having the largest collection of Hotwheels cars. He has been collecting cars from 1968 till today.
