School buses on RTO radar

NASHIK: With most schools set to reopen on June 16, the Nashik Regional Transport Office (RTO) had begun inspection of buses this week to ensure all safety measures complied with ferrying students. A meeting of the school transport committee was held a week, before 16th June, in which, nearly 250 representatives of 110 schools in the district were guided regarding implementation of the state school bus policy. Regional Transport Officer Jeevan Bansod said, "We will focus on ensuring safe travel of all students, considering that all the schools will reopen by June 16. A meeting of the school transport committee was held last week. Now, we will take up a drive to check school buses". The drive will be conducted across the city and the district to check whether the school

bus drivers have the minimum experience of five years. The fitness certificates of the vehicles will be checked, along with the permits and insurance documents. The speed governors have to be installed in the school buses. He added, "Taking into consideration the incidents in some cities, wherein, girls were molested by the school bus drivers or attendants, we would be specifically checking if all the buses ferrying girls have a female attendant. This has to be implemented even if there is only one girl in the school bus". Inspector (motor vehicles) Shahid Jamadaar, who guided the school representatives during the meeting, said that often schools argue that their responsibility towards the students starts only after they enter the school premises."We made it clear to the representatives that the safety

of school students was the responsibility of all. Among other things, we asked the representatives to create a file in the school that has the details of the routes of the school buses, the halts and names of students travelling". He said while the bus drivers are required to have five years driving experience, the school representatives were told that it would be good if the attendants in the bus also have a driving license. Among other things, the representatives were told that the footboard of the school bus should be less than 220 mm, there should be a mirror inside the bus so that the driver can get the view of all the children seated in the bus. RTO officials said that they appealed the school authorities to conduct one period on transportation of students in their respective schools.



FIFA 2014 WORLD CUP

The 2014 FIFA World Cup is the 20th FIFA World Cup, a tournament for the men's football world championship that is currently taking place in Brazil. It began on 12 June, with a group stage, and is scheduled to conclude on 13 July with the final. It is the second time that Brazil has hosted the competition, the first being in 1950. Brazil was elected unchallenged as host nation in 2007 after the international football federation, FIFA, decreed that the tournament would be staged in South America for the first time since 1978 in Argentina, and the fifth time overall. The national teams of 31 countries advanced through qualification competitions that began in June 2011 to participate with the host nation Brazil in the final tournament. A total of 64 matches are being played in 12 cities across Brazil in either new or redeveloped stadiums. For the first time World Cup finals, match officials are using goal-line technology, as well as vanishing foam for free kicks. With the host country, all world champion teams since the first World Cup in 1930: Argentina, England, France, Germany (who won three times as West Germany), Italy, Spain and Uruguay, have qualified for this competition. Spain, the defending champion, having defeated the Netherlands 1–0 in the 2010 final to win its first World Cup. All previous four World Cup tournaments staged in South America were won by South American teams.

New technologies that are being introduced to World Cup football for the first time include goal-line technology, vanishing foam, and improved football production technology. For the first time a

the mistake in this game, FIFA President Sepp Blatter said, "It would be a nonsense not to reopen the file on goal-line technology" and in 2012 the IFAB approved its usage. This is the fourth FIFA competition to use the technology

Cup Finals. The water-based spray, which disappears within minutes of application, can be used to mark a ten-yard line for the defending team during a free kick and also to draw where the ball is to be placed for a free kick.

The Brazuca is the official match ball of the 2014 FIFA World Cup. It is made by the company Adidas, a FIFA Partner and FIFA World Cup Official Match Ball supplier since 1970. Adidas created a new design of ball after criticisms of the Adidas Jabulani used in the previous World Cup. The number of panels was reduced to six, with the panels being thermally bonded. This created a ball with increased consistency and aerodynamics compared to its predecessor. Furthermore Adidas underwent an extensive testing process lasting more than two years to produce a ball that would meet the approval of football professionals. The Brazuca was manufactured by Forward Sports of Sialkot, Pakistan, for Adidas.

We're only a few days into the FIFA WORLD CUP, but according to the bookmakers this competition is already down to just three teams. According to the bookies, it's going to be Brazil, Argentina or Germany that takes home the trophy in the final on July 13, according to the professional odds makers.



World Cup Finals, the officials are being assisted by goal-line technology. The previous World Cup was a catalyst for the decision to adopt technology after England was denied a goal in their round of 16 match against Germany. Following

Cup and 2013 Confederations Cup. The German company Goal Control was selected as the tournament's official goal-line technology provider in October 2013. Following successful trials, FIFA approved the use of vanishing foam by the referees for the first time at a World

MOVIE REVIEWS

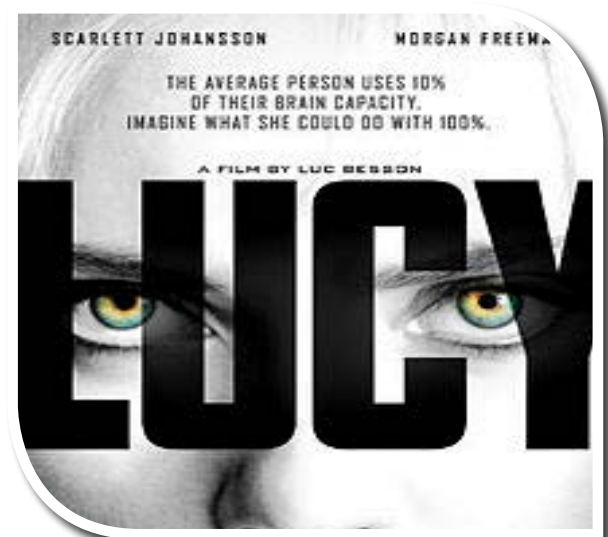

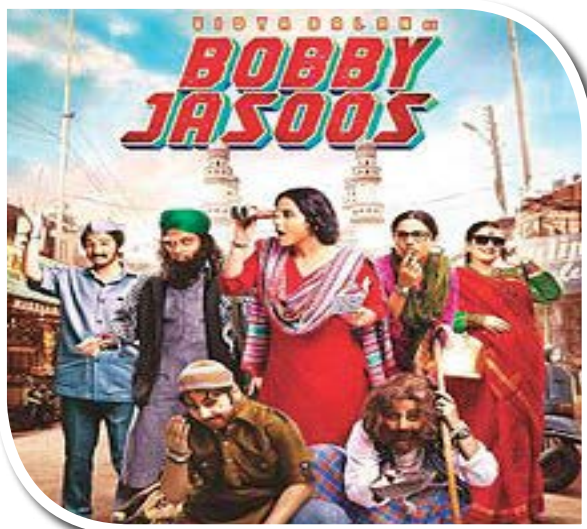
Lucy is a story dealing with technology. An action-thriller that tracks a woman (Scarlett Johansson) ac-

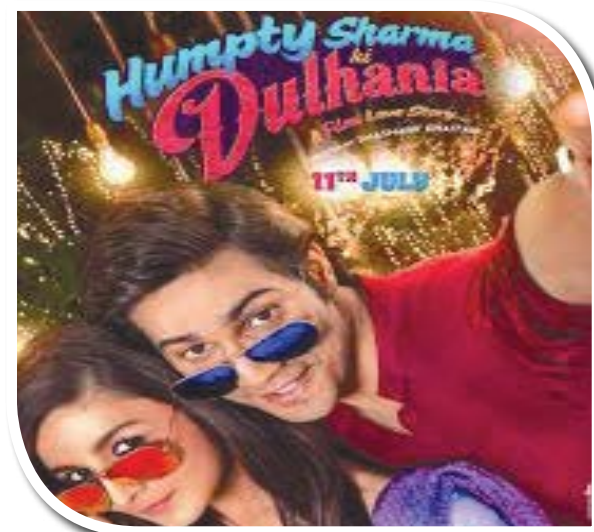
BOLLYWOOD

Display

This is where the S5 begins to win us back over. The full hd 1080p 5.1-inch Super AMOLED display is a sight to behold, and Samsung's really worked their display tech to deliver what has to be one of the (if not the) best smart phone screens we've seen. Camera

The 16MP snapper is plenty impressive, with autofocus that is wicked fast and pictures that reveal high amounts of detail and accurate colors. SENNHEISER GAME ZERO

In terms of sound quality, the headphones are everything you'd expect from Sennheiser. It performs like every mid- to high-end piece should – no distortion even when maxed out, and a perfect stereo balance to make games like last of us worth it. The Zero is one of those few headsets that can completely cover your ears and remain comfy despite using them for hours. What's more, these cans will filter out all the distractions from the real world and instead focus your attention on the other world where cutting off

alien heads and stomping pedestrians for their money takes precedence over everything else. The first of two features we're excited about is the placement on the volume dial on the right earcup. It may not seem like much now, but while gaming, that bit was a blessing. Knowing where you need to go to adjust the volume saves valuable time as opposed to having to look for the volume dial along the wire-line. Similarly, the mic on the left earcup has an auto mute and an auto noise cancellation feature. The noise cancellation kicks in

when a user speaks, reducing background noise to almost nothing. While not using the mic, simply pushing it up to a vertical position turns on the auto mute.

Verdict: The headset is revolutionary from a gaming perspective. Unfortunately, there aren't enough features to justify the price.

Pros: The placement of the volume dial and the mic's auto mute feature.

Cons: Not enough bang for your buck.

The Presidential state car is the official state car used by the President of the United States. A variety of vehicles have both officially and unofficially been acknowledged as the presidential vehicle. Since the late 1930s, the Federal government of the United States has specially commissioned vehicles for presidential use, often specifying advanced communications equipment, special convenience features, armor plating, and defense countermeasures. American cars are traditionally chosen for the role. The most recent vehicle to be customized as the presidential car is a Chevrolet Kodiak-based, Cadillac-badged limousine often referred to as Cadillac One and occasionally as Limo One (a reference to the U.S. presiden-

tial aircraft, Air Force One) The current presidential limousine entered service on January 20, 2009. According to the manufacturer, General Motors, the 2009 presidential limousine, based on the Cadillac DTS is the first not to carry a specific model name. The vehicle's outward appearance carries many current Cadillac styling themes, but does not resemble any particular production vehicle. The body itself seems to be a modification of the immediately previous DTS-badged Presidential limousines, but the vehicle's chassis and driveline are sourced from the Chevrolet Kodiak commercial truck. Many body components are sourced from a variety of Cadillac vehicles; for example, the car

uses Cadillac Escalade headlights, side mirrors and door handles. The tail of the car seems to use the taillights and back up lights from the Cadillac STS sedan. Although a price tag has not been announced, each limousine is assumed to cost US\$300,000.

General specifications

The Secret Service refers to the heavily armored vehicle as The Beast. Most details of the car are classified for security reasons. A special night vision system is in a secret location. Special loops replace the stock door handles; agents hold on to them when running alongside the car. Goodyear run-flat tires fit into extra-large wheel well. The car is sealed against biochemical attacks. Kept in the trunk is a blood bank of the President's blood type. It also has its own oxygen supply.

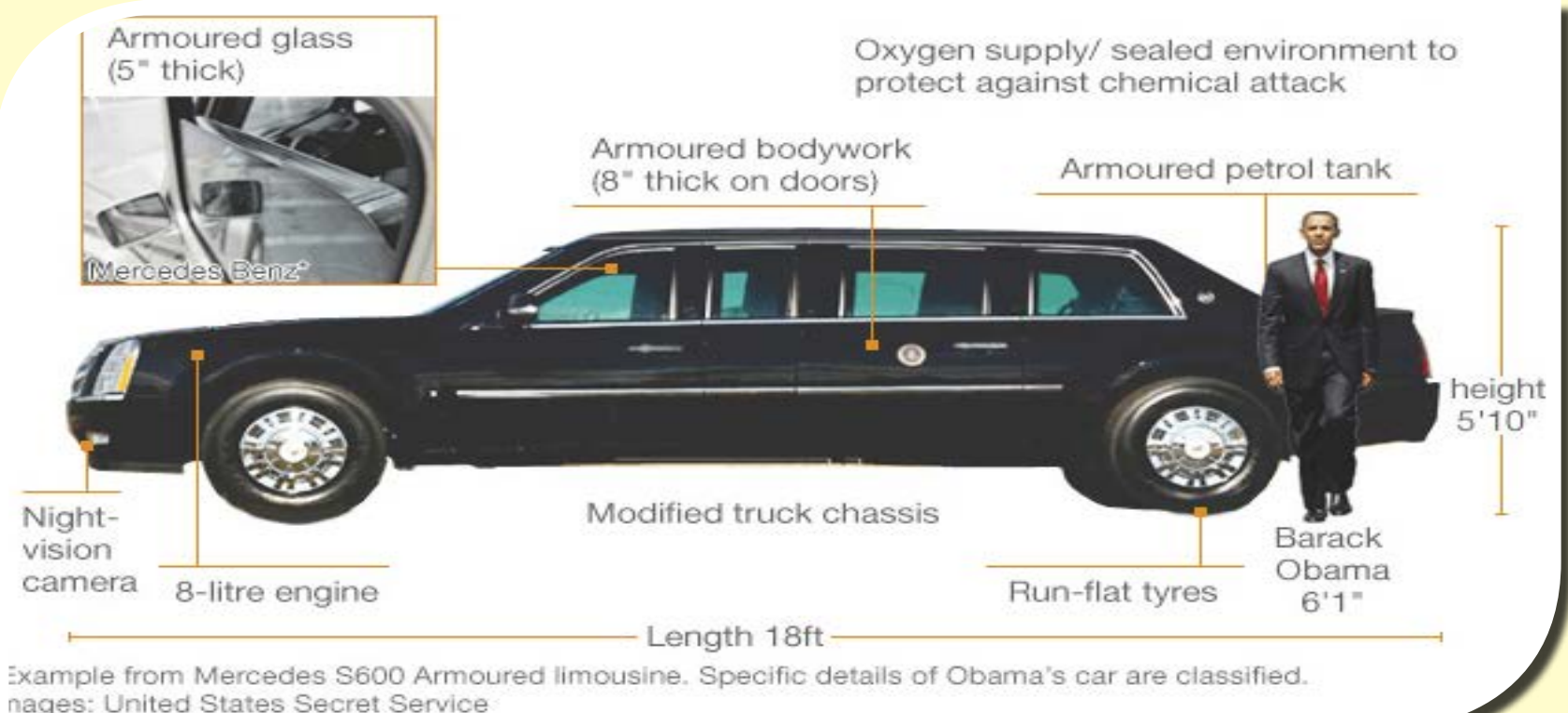
The car can seat seven people, including the President. The front seats two, and includes a console-mounted communications center. A glass partition divides the front from back. Three rear-facing seats are in the back, with cushions that are able to fold over the partition. The two rear seats are reserved for the president and another passenger; these seats have the ability to recline individually. A folding desk is between the two rear seats. Storage compartments in the interior panels of the car contain communications equipment

which is called the Limousine Control Package and is operated by the White House Communications Agency. This is the voice and data device that links the vehicle to the WHCA Roadrunner at the rear of the motorcade allowing command and control (or "C2") functions to be performed from the limo. The trunk lid has five antennas. The car is driven by a specially trained Secret Service agent who is capable of performing a J-turn. The President's lead protective agent usually sits in the front passenger seat.

On domestic trips, vehicles carrying the president display the American and Presidential Standard flags, which are illuminated by directional flood lights mounted on the hood. When the President performs a state visit to a foreign country, the Presidential Standard is replaced by the foreign country's flag. The limousine is airlifted for domestic and international use primarily by a U.S. Air Force C-17 Globe-master III. The vehicle fuel efficiency is about 8 miles per US gallon (29 L/100 km; 9.6 mpg)

The United States government also operates similarly designed limousines for VIP guests, visiting heads of government, and heads of state.
